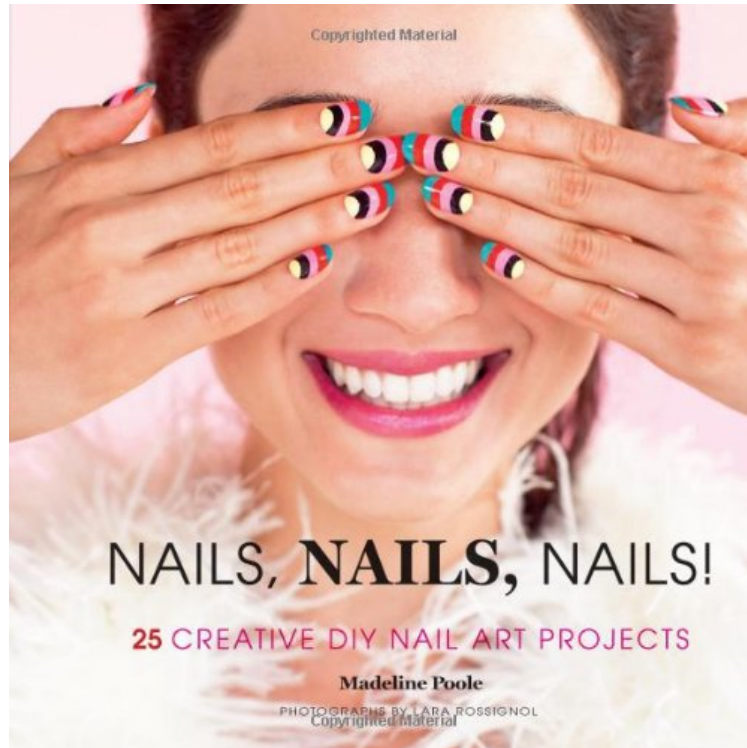

What I really like is the structure of the book, and especially the page where you can see all the designs on one page. I don't have to bookmark or go searching through the book - I just go to the one page where they are all displayed and can get to the appropriate design quickly from there (Kindle versions have links to the pages). I like that there are not just designs from freehand, but also other techniques such as masking and ombre effect too. I'm giving this four stars because for the price there really should be more designs. I knew how many I was buying since it's listed on the front of the book, but without knowing what you are getting, it's hard to judge if the Kindle price of \$7.99 is worth it for 25 designs. Now that I've had a chance to go through it, I do think there should be more designs for that price; maybe more like 50.
