Jewelry makers can choose from a variety of bracelets, necklaces, earrings and pendants. All the projects are made using unique patterns (not the basic, traditional weaves). The jewelry is colorful, creative, and very wearable. Even advanced chain mailers will learn something new in this book: how to incorporate glass and rubber rings for beautiful results.
