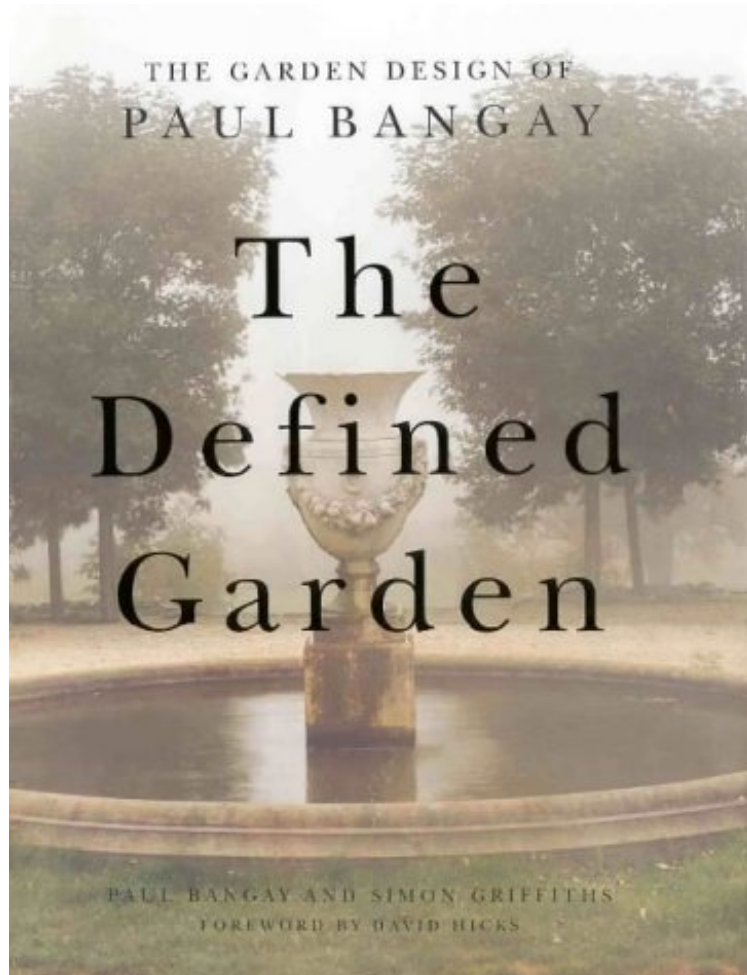

His designs are basically 'architectural' in that he uses sculptured hedges, formally pleached trees and careful use of axis to create traditionally formal gardens with a modern twist. The principles that he espouses are not confined to only cool climate (ie English) gardens. In this book, gardens designed in more tropical

regions achieve the same amount of polish and perfection by using the same underlying structure. There are also examples of courtyard gardens, as well as larger estates.
